If you are a Rotarian and have an RV (pop-up, Class A, B, or C motor home, 5th wheel or trailer), join our fun group!



WHAT IS RVF?

The RV Fellowship of North America was chartered as a fellowship in 1972. The Fellowship has about 400 members, organized into four zones — Pacific, Mountain, Central and Eastern.



The group has an Annual Rally. Our time together may include bus tours of the area — a great way to have fun and explore.

When the RI Convention is held in North America, the RVF Annual Rally is held in conjunction with the Convention. RVF will meet four days prior to the RI Convention and spend that time getting to know old friends better, and make new ones.



Regional Rallies

Rotarians in each of the four regions will have Area Rallies. Sometimes these are done on a semi-annual basis, and in some areas, rallies are held quarterly. It's a great way to get to know Rotarians outside of your club and community, and have fun while meeting new people who share your interest in the RV lifestyle.



Wagon Master

Someone has to be in charge, and in our Fellowship, the person in charge of a rally is the Wagon Master. This is the person who arranges the place to camp, the meals, tours, recreation and social times. Depending on the location of the rally, the group might gather around a campfire and share their Rotary stories. There is usually an attitude adjustment time early in the evening. The evening meal may be a potluck, a catered meal, or a trip to a local restaurant. Whatever the venue, we have fun!

Service Project

As service-minded Rotarians and RVers, we have a Highway Safety Program. At our annual rally, a contribution will be made to a local agency — either the fire department, the police, or emergency medical service. Our goal is to find what piece of equipment is most needed in the area to support highway safety. In the past, we have provided Jaws of Life, defibrillators, and other specialized equipment.
